


Side by Side International

1006 Activity Report



Two members from Side by Side International (NPO) visited Cambodia in October. They went to 7 schools, 3 orphanages, 3 hospitals and a slum village, etc. in 5 provinces to distribute their original bilingual (English and Cambodian) books for Cambodian children, which were printed in Cambodia During their stay they were

invited to the 10th anniversary of the Sihanouk Hospital where the King Sihamoni also attended and gave a speech. They also went to see some medical equipment computers and other items they had previously donated to different places. Thank you for your

When the motorbike stops in front of the schools, the students can send and receive E-mails from the computers that are powered by solar panels. The system also is used for "Tele-medicine" treatments by the Sihanouk Hospital and some hospitals in the U.S. Many villages in the area have no electricity or phone-lines.

Sihanouk Hospital (Phnom Peng)



The under-5 mortality rate Out of 1,000) is 140. The percentage of under-fives suffering from moderate to severe underweight is 45%. The percentage of the population using adequate sanitation facilities is 15%. The percentage of the population using improved drinking water sources is 34%. The population living on below \$1 a day is 34%. (The State of the World's Children 2005-UNICEF)

Visiting Northern Thailand (and Myanmar and Laos)

The Side by Side members visited the National Mae Sai hospital in Northern Thailand with the members of the Japan International Friendship & Welfare Foundation. JIFF runs the medical training center here in collaboration with the Mae Fah Luang Foundation in Thailand that was founded by the late mother of the King Bhumibol. Side by Side provided all the basic equipment needed for setting up the hospital, including a couple of ambulances and the CT in 2004.









The Mae Fah Luang Foundation has worked for the improvement of the lives of the hill tribes in the Golden Triangle where opium poppies used to be widely cultivated. The key strategies of this foundation are: the creation of alternative employment opportunities,

the introduction of Crop Substitution Programs, vocational training, implementation of health services, etc.











At the request of the Tanzanian government, the SBSI sent a fire engine and enough dental equipment to set up two clinics.
